



GETTING IN

ORGANISED TRANSPORTS

The organisers set up two meeting points, one at the Fiumicino Airport and one at the Ciampino Airport, where you will be picked up by bus at the following schedules:

From Fiumicino Airport	22nd of September
Terminal 2	8:30
Terminal 2	11:30
Terminal 2	14:30

Participants landing after 16:00 will be met in the airport by the organisers and they will receive tickets for the train going from the airport to Termini Station.

From Ciampino Airport	22nd of September
Arrivi/Arrivals	10:30

! IMPORTANT NOTICE: If you cannot make the schedules, you will have to organise your own transportation from the airports:

FROM FIUMICINO AIRPORT TO TERMINI TRAIN STATION

Option A, by train: Inside the airport you will find directions that lead you to the Fiumicino Airport Train Station. Take the Leonardo Express train going directly to Termini, which leaves every 30 minutes. The cost of the ticket is 14€. The tickets are available at the counter and at automatic vending machines as well as at the departure platform (more expensive). You cannot buy a ticket for a specific train (it is just a general ticket for any schedule), so remember to always get your ticket stamped in a yellow validation machine just before using it. Option B, by bus/ shuttle: [COTRAL](#) operates buses (also during the night) from both airports to the city. Don't forget to mark your ticket after getting on the bus; if the machine doesn't work, you have to write your name, birth date and current date & time on the ticket. If you arrive or depart during the night at Fiumicino, the [airport shuttle](#) is probably your best bet. They charge EUR 25.00 per passenger and are very reliable. Visit their website or phone (+39) 0642013469 or (+39) 064740451. Advance booking essential.



Option C, by taxi: The cost of the service is 40 euro, baggage included, for a maximum of four passengers, for all the destinations inside the *Mura Aureliane* (the central area of the city where both your hotel and the first conference venue are located).

Warning! Beware of Crooks: Licensed limousine drivers may approach you at the airports, particularly Fiumicino, the fares are about 80 €. **Be aware as well of unlicensed "taxi" drivers.** Go directly to the taxi stand and ignore touts. The cars for the taxi service of the City of Rome are white and can be recognized by the sign "TAXI" on the top and by the identifying licence number on the doors, on the back and inside the car.

FROM CIAMPINO AIRPORT TO TERMINI TRAIN STATION

From Ciampino airport, you can take the bus from the stop located outside the terminal building to Metro Line A Anagnina station (ticket: €1.20). A metro ticket to Termini Train Station costs another €1. There are also buses at the same price to Ciampino local train station; from there there is a train to Rome Termini station (ticket: €2). The buses operate roughly every hour or 30 minutes during the Italian work day (8-12 and 16-20), and you should count on at least 45 minutes travel time for either route. The Metro can get very crowded. Timetable booklets are available in some information booths.

There are a few direct bus services from Ciampino, all of which go to the Termini in Downtown Rome:

- [Sit bus shuttle](#) runs a line that costs €6 one-way or €10 with return (approx. 40 min, with about 25 services a day).
- [Terravision](#). Please note that this is a dedicated airport-city transfer only for the major low-cost airlines. The price is €6 one-way or €12 return when booked online (approx. 40 min, with a service every 30 min). It is advised that passengers on the return trip from Termini board the bus 3 hours before their flight's departure time.

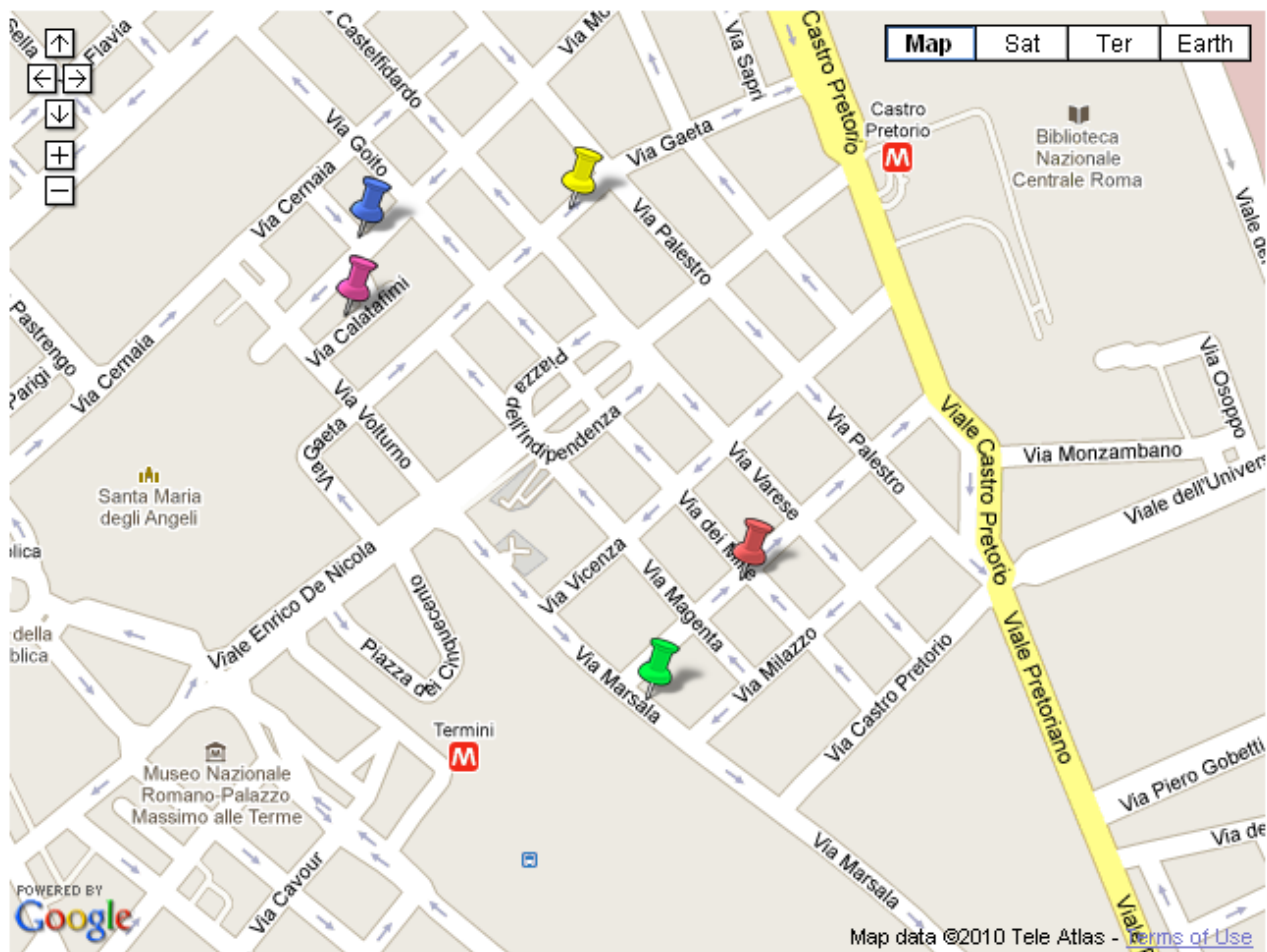

Rome (Italian: Roma, Latin: Roma) is the capital city of Italy and of the Lazio region. It is located in the central-western portion of the Italian peninsula, where the river Aniene joins the Tiber.

An enclave of Rome is the State of the Vatican City, the sovereign territory of the Holy See, the smallest nation in the world.

Rome, Caput mundi ("capital of the world"), la Città Eterna ("the Eternal City"), Limen Apostolorum ("threshold of the Apostles"), la città dei sette colli ("the city of the seven hills") or simply l'Urbe ("the City"), is thoroughly modern and cosmopolitan. As one of the few major European cities that escaped World War II relatively unscathed, central Rome remains essentially Renaissance and Baroque in character. The Historic Centre of Rome is listed by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site.

Rome is traditionally thought to have been founded by the mythical twins Romulus and Remus, who were abandoned as infants in the Tiber River and raised by a mother wolf before being found by a shepherd who raised them as his own sons.

THE SEVEN HILLS OF ROME

The seven hills are: Quirinal, Viminal, Esquiline, Caelian, Aventine, Palatine and Capitoline Hills. A mnemonic device used to memorise the names of the hills gives them in clockwise order, starting with the Quirinal. It is: Queen Victoria Eyes Caesar's Awfully Painful Corns.

CLIMATE

In September temperatures vary around 22° C and there are chances of sporadic rain.

"MUST SEES" IF IN ROME FOR THE FIRST TIME

Start with the obvious choices of the Sistine Chapel, the Vatican Museums and St Peter's Basilica. Catch your breath over a leisurely lunch around Piazza Navona. Pass by the Pantheon before exploring the Roman Forum and Colosseum in the afternoon. Make a night of it in lively and atmospheric Trastevere.

Spend a morning at the market in Campo dé Fiori and the Capitoline Museums. Let the ancient wonders at Palazzo Massimo alle Terme captivate you, before plumbing Rome's multilayered history at the San Clemente Basilica. Wander through Villa Borghese and visit the magnificent, and hopefully prebooked, Galleria Borghese. Or get some retail action at the swish designer stores around Via Condotti. Naturally, spend your evenings on a passeggiata (stroll) - with gelato - from Piazza di Spagna to the Trevi Fountain where . Check out 'Il Campo' for fun after dark, or stay out far later than you should in Testaccio.



BANKS AND SHOPPING

Banks are open from Monday to Friday, generally from 8:30 to 13:30. There are numerous ATMs which accept both debit and credit cards. Most shops are open from 10:00 to 19:30, some close for lunch between 13:30 and 16:00. Department stores are open non-stop from 09:00 to 20:00, six days a week.

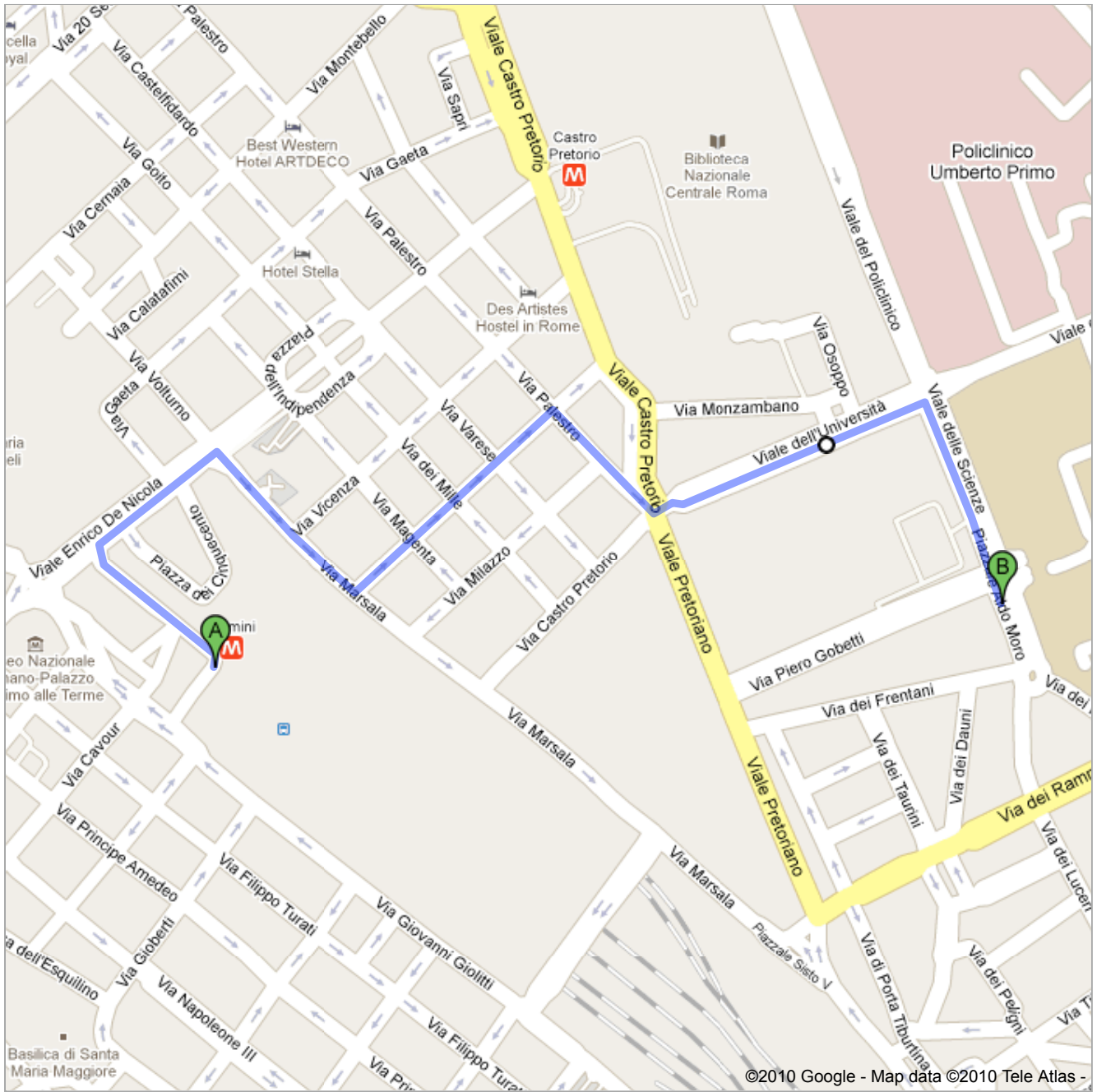



Directions to Piazzale Aldo Moro, 00185 Roma, Italy
